Why a Focus on Legal Status?

- Legal status issues can be a barrier to providing services to immigrant and refugee families.
- There is no "one size fits all" approach. Families may have members with different statuses, including citizenship, permanent resident status, DACA, temporary visas, undocumented status, and more.
- Migration Policy Institute estimates that at least 14.4 million individuals in the United States live in mixed-status families that were excluded from initial 2020 COVID-19 stimulus payments.

The Two-Generation (2Gen) Approach




Two-generation (2Gen) approaches build family well-being by intentionally and simultaneously working with children and the adults in their lives together.

2Gen Core Components




