








Rural COVID-19 Reported Cases/Deaths as a Percentage of the U.S Total *February 20 – September 20, 2020*




Rural COVID-19 Cases Per 100,000, March 16














Rural COVID-19 Cases Per 100,000, July 8



Rural COVID-19 Cases Per 100,000, August 2




Rural COVID-19 Cases Per 100,000, September 20






UNEMPLOYMENT RATE OUTSIDE METROPOLITAN AREAS 2019-2020 (not seasonally adjusted)




Unemployment Outside of Metropolitan Areas, June 2020







How People's Housing Has Been Impacted by COVID-19











Housing Affordability Problems, 1980
