








Amount of Local Sales Taxes Collected





Condition of the Wildlife






Demand for Historic Activities



Student Perceived Changes in Community Ability for Public Services to Meet Demand






In each gambling community, over 63% of the change in the ability for public services to meet demand was attributed to gambling.

Variety of Cultural Facilities and Activities




In each gambling community, over 66% of the change in variety of cultural facilities and activities was attributed to gambling.

Financial Resources of Service Agencies




In each gambling community, over 73% of the change in financial resources of service agencies was attributed to gambling.

Crowds Affecting Enjoyment of Public Areas




In each gambling community, over 84% of the change in crowds affecting enjoyment of public areas was attributed to gambling.




In each gambling community, over 79% of the change in variety of social opportunities for residents was attributed to gambling.

Understanding of Different People




In each gambling community, over 55% of the change in resident understanding of different people and cultures was attributed to gambling.






Student Contact with Gambling Are Members in the Household Employed by Gambling?








Living in State when Gambling Was Approved





How Many Blocks to Nearest Gambling Establishment?





How Many Miles to Nearest Gambling Establishment?






